
Location 1: Reckondales Playing Fields (Low Catton Rd, Stamford Bridge YO41 1DS. ///falls.greeting.ripen)

Location 2: Stamford Bridge Cricket Club (Low Catton Rd, Stamford Bridge, York YO41 1DZ. ///doses.season.cure)

Location 3: Brown Moor Playing fields (Brown Moor Field, off Roman Avenue South, YO41 1EZ. ///events.slyly.reflect)

Sites 1 and 2 are accessed from Low Catton Road and have parking available on site. Site 3 is accessed from Roman Avenue South and also has parking on site. When exiting the Brown Moor Site please turn left at the T junction onto Roman Avenue, this is to avoid oncoming traffic.

Match times are staggered to enable sufficient parking. Please do not arrive more than half an hour before your match is due to kick off.



Facilities

There are toilets available for use at all sites. Please make sure that they are used. If they are locked please speak to your home coach about opening them. There is also catering available on match days. We take pride in maintaining our pitches and equipment. **Please help to keep our sites in good condition by taking any litter home with you and using any litter bins provided**. Dogs are not allowed on playing areas at any time. If there are any issues with the facilities please inform the lead coach as soon as possible.

First Aid

All our lead coaches have first aid training and will be around to support in matches and sessions. However, in case of emergencies call 999 as soon as possible. Defibrillators and first aid kits are available at all sites.

The nearest accident and emergency unit is at York hospital (Wiggington Road, Clifton, York YO31 8HE).

Safeguarding

All lead coaches have safeguarding training and all coaching staff have enhanced DBS clearance. We also have a club appointed welfare officer and mental wellness champion. For more information and contact details please visit the safeguarding page on our website

SPECTATORS

We all bear a collective responsibility to set a good example and help provide a positive environment in which children can learn and enjoy the game. Play your part and observe The FA's Respect Code of Conduct for spectators at all times.

I WILL:

- Remember that children play for FUN
- Applaud effort and good play as well as success
- Respect the Referee's decisions even when you don't agree with them
- Appreciate good play from whatever team it comes from
- Remain behind the touchline and within the Designated Spectators' Area
- Let the coach do their job and not confuse the players by telling them what to do
- Encourage the players to respect the opposition, referee and match officials
- Support positively and offer players encouragement not criticism
- Never engage in, or tolerate offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour
